KEEPING RSL BEAUTIFUL – WE CAN HELP!

Riverside Lakes is a neighborhood unique in its attributes. RSL Lakes has what most lake neighborhoods do not have: mature trees, large green space, playground, sand volleyball, baseball diamond, tennis courts, basketball hoop, walking trail, a bluebird nesting community, fishing, and the best sunsets. But sometimes the upkeep and maintenance of lake life can be overwhelming... after all who wants to work when you can play??

If you are **OVERWHELMED** by the maintenance and **have trees that need trimmed, shore stations that need repaired/removed or excess materials and debris that need disposed of** CONTACT the RSL HOA. Don't let lack of time or interest stand in the way of keeping RSL tidy. Keeping RSL tidy also increases the property value of our neighborhood.

Please contact the RSL HOA for assistance with the following items:

- Tree and shrub trimming particularly trees and landscaping near the street. It's imperative that for the safety of all that roadways are kept clear of overhanging branches, overgrown shrubs etc. so oncoming traffic, pedestrians, children are always visible
- Nonliving landscaping/trees cutback and or removed
- Shore stations that are nonoperational require removal or repair
- Jet ski docking station repair or removal
- Dock repairs
- Excess materials / debris surrounding residence removed.

We have contractors that will provide services for minimal fees.

DON'T FENCE ME IN



We have had a number of inquiries about fences. Fences are addressed in the covenants – they "must be approved in regard to heights, materials, and locations; however no beaches may be fenced. "The role of the architectural committee is to make sure that fences comply with the covenants. The covenants are pretty clear about no fencing the beaches, but the committee and HOA Board have some discretion in terms of height, material, and location. As a Board, we understand the desire for some homeowners to have fences

for dogs. Our goal is to help homeowners find a fencing solution that meets their needs but also does not impede the view of neighbors and is aesthetically pleasing for not just the homeowner and next door neighbors, but also for those across the lake. If you are considering a fence, we hope that you will consider the option of an invisible fence. If this is not feasible for your situation, the general height, material, and location guidelines that will be considered are: (1) height of no more than four feet, (2) wrought iron, and (3) the fence should be located close to the house and as far from the beach as possible.
